
Iti Yay nay Lopot

Nanigo hilan pawili.


It blows on the grasses.

The blue umbrella flips, too.






Ampi- lipag-lipag yay kapoti.

The raincoat flaps.


The flag flaps.

Nanabo yay palanggana bisa ya nitoril-toril.


Blag! Blag! Blag!

The cat closes its eyes the more.**






Nalayam na syimprin asoy lopot.

The dog feels the wind, too.


The dog closes its eyes the more.
